

Getting to Malta

Malta is easily accessible by air from all major European cities, and there are low-cost connections from many of them. Direct flights via Air Malta as can be viewed on www.airmalta.com.

Transport

The Conference Venue is at Ta' Cenc Hotel in Gozo, which is Malta's sister island. Gozo is reached via a pleasant 30-minute ferry trip from Cirkewwa, Malta to Mgarr, Gozo.

The entire trip from Malta International Airport to the Conference venue might take up to 3 hours, depending on the arrival time of your flight and the ferry schedule (www.gozochannel.com).

The following transport options are available:

Option A: Direct Service - Malta Airport to Conference Venue.

The driver will accompany you throughout the whole journey. You may have to wait to board the ferry depending on the queue of vehicles; however your luggage will remain in the vehicle throughout your journey. At €65, this is the more expensive option. A maximum of 3 people may share the taxi.

Option B: Split Service - Malta Airport to Cirkewwa Ferry, Mgarr Ferry to Conference Venue

The driver will take you to Cirkewwa where you will board the ferry immediately. Please note that you will have to carry your luggage on board the ferry. A second driver will meet you in Mgarr to take you to the Conference venue. At €30, this is the cheaper option. A maximum of 3 people may share the taxi.

Kindly contact us at director.doi.opm@gov.mt if you would like to avail yourselves of these transport options. Larger groups (over five) arriving in Malta at similar times can also benefit from group rates starting from around €10 per person.

Accommodation

Due to the secluded location of the conference venue and transport limitations, it is highly recommended that you book your accommodation at the Ta' Cenc Hotel. We have secured a limited number of rooms at the preferential rates hereunder:
